

"The Ministry of Peace concerns itself with war," wrote Orwell. A few years earlier, Roosevelt had described the fourth of his freedoms as "freedom from fear." However, the reality was different and Orwell also highlighted this in his description of the "Ministry of Peace."

Orwell wrote that the "Ministry of Love" was focused on torture, which goes against the ideal of love. The second freedom in the four freedoms addresses the issue of religion, and if we believe that "*God is love*", then the term "Ministry of Love" could be seen as ridiculing this concept.

Finally, Orwell sarcastically described the "Ministry of Plenty" as dealing with starvation. Roosevelt's third freedom addressed the issue of freedom from want.
